
The Basics:
Please see the drive-through greeter as you enter, they will give you advice on what direction to go to find your perfect tree. We have pull carts and saws available to make things easier. Our staff will measure and price your tree when you return to the baling station. No vehicles are permitted in the fields. Pets must be kept on leashes and cleaned up after.

10011 Jackson Rd Remote Field



The Basics / Cutting Down a Tree (for new customers and those who want a refresher):

- 1) **Borrow a saw and a tree cart.** Use our supplies to sanitize them if you so choose.
- 2) **Select a tree and cut it down.** Our map shows varieties, but it is not a perfect science. Talking to a greeter about your wishes is your best bet. It helps to keep an open mind as you search for your tree.
- 3) **Can we top a tree?** This year it is better for us, and thus better for you as a future customer, if you take the top of an older tree that has a pretty top and an ugly bottom. This saves younger trees for future years so that we have plenty of nice trees the next time you come. It also gives a home to older trees that might not otherwise get asked to the dance. You can top a tree in any field this year, and you pay only for what you take home. We trust your judgment in choosing a tree that is suitable for topping (cut the nice top off of a tree with an ugly bottom, as opposed to cutting a nice tree in half). Please cut the entire tree down for safety and leave the part you don't want by the stump for us to clean up later. Don't forget to leave enough trunk for your tree stand and presents (usually a foot or so).
- 4) **Shake and bale your tree.** If we are open, we are happy to help you shake and bale your tree. Shaking is not an option in self-serve fields, but you are welcome to bale your tree yourself (instructions are posted near the baler).
- 5) **Pay for your tree** (pay a cashier in a field with help or follow posted instructions in self-serve fields). Price for u-cut trees is \$59 for all trees 5.5ft and less, or \$10 per foot for all trees 6ft and above. Pre-cut trees are individually priced, and if not individually priced we charge by the foot (same as U-cut trees).
- 6) **Greeters will guide you.** If you are a newbie let our greeters give you the supplemental information that you need to make your day at the farm as productive and fun-filled as possible.

What is New This Year:

- 1) **Face masks.** Face masks are optional this year. We hope that you will choose to wear them in our barn, and when close to staff and other customers (when waiting in lines for example), and we will greatly appreciate those customers who do so.
- 2) **Indoor and outdoor retail areas.** We again have both indoor and outdoor retail areas this year. Both areas have lots of good stuff to choose from (pretty much the same stuff), but there is a bit more variety in the barn. The full refreshment stand with hot drinks and cookies is also in the barn.
- 3) **You can pay** in many places (in the barn, in the outdoor retail area, and through an open window on the west end of the barn (by the twine box). In the satellite fields payment options are self-explanatory.
- 4) **Refreshments** Hot drinks and cookies are available in the main barn only. We have pre-packaged snacks and drinks in both the barn and the outdoor retail area and the satellite fields.
- 5) **Pre-cut trees** have been moved west to spread people out. We have more varieties than in the past.
- 6) **Tractor rides** are for fun only this year, and we are giving people breathing room for safety. Tractor rides start at the green steps just north of the pre-cut trees, west of the main barn. You can access the field the tractor went to in prior years by driving in your car to the Jackson Road Field on the map.

Rules and FAQ

- 1) **No driving in fields**, unless allowed by the greeters (may be allowed in certain areas on certain days for certain trees).
- 2) **Pets are welcome** as long as they stay on a leash and you clean up after them.
- 3) **Cut all trees within 4 inches of the ground.** If topping a tree, please cut the whole tree down first and leave the part you don't want by the stump.
- 4) **Be very careful with tree carts and saws.** Tree cart handles are heavy and can hurt if you let go of them. Saws are very sharp. If you plan to let your kids hold and/or use these items they need constant and direct supervision. Parents need to be very careful as well.
- 5) **Please be careful not to hurt younger trees.** It takes a very long time for a young tree to become a Christmas tree and they are very fragile when they are young. Please be careful where you walk and supervise your children carefully.
